


From the Desk of Pastor Kim

The official start to summer, June 22nd, has come which means the official start to my summer reading has begun! These long days, absent of all of the obligations and schedules of the school year, just begs for time on a hammock with my head buried in a NY Times bestseller or book that has been patiently waiting for months on my bedside table to be read. A few naps might occur as well.

The Beekeeper of Aleppo by Christy Lefteri I heard about this book a couple of years ago and have been on the hunt for a copy and found it last month at the Bethesda Thrift Shop. It is about Nuri, a beekeeper, and his wife Afra, an artist. They live a simple life, rich in family and friends, in the hills of the beautiful Syrian city of Aleppo - until the unthinkable happens. Devastated by war and destruction, they have no other choice than to leave their home. To escape Syria, they must take the perilous journey through Turkey, Greece and England as well as navigate their grief, smugglers, language barriers and immigration process to be granted asylum.



I hope that this book will help open my eyes to the risks and challenges that people take in order to leave their country to try to begin a life somewhere new, especially in light of the recent influx of refugees to Green Bay from Afghanistan.




Cloud Cuckoo Land by Anthony Doerr I fell in love with the beautiful writing of Anthony Doerr in one of my favorite books, *All the Light We Cannot See*. If you would like to read this book, the Bethel Library has a copy to check-out. So when his latest book came out right before Christmas, I gifted myself a copy. How could I pass it up when one of the reviewers claims, "As intimate as a bedtime story, a love letter to libraries and bibliophiles."

Spanning from the 15th century, to present day in an Idaho library, to a not-sodistant future, the story is about children on the cusp of adulthood in worlds in peril, who find resilience, hope, and a book. I can't wait to begin this in August on my vacation!

Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson

During the synod assembly, I attended a workshop presented by a men's group from St John's in Ashwaubenon. A few years ago, they decided to go on a racial equity journey. They began by reading this book and discussing it together. This learning has spread to their entire congregation and they even presented a resolution to the assembly about how we can become anti-racist synod, which passed. Using a Thrivent grant, they gifted workshop attendees a copy of the book, which you can now find in the Bethel library.



Just Mercy takes us inside America's broken criminal justice system and compels us to confront inequality and injustice. As an attorney, Bryan Stevenson defends the poor, the incarcerated and the wrongly condemned. Through the

work of his organization Equal Justice Initiative, a non-profit law office in Alabama, he is committed to changing the narrative about race in America by working for criminal justice reform.

I would like to challenge us to read the book as a congregation, and get together in September to discuss it as Bethel begins its own racial equity journey. Knowing that not everyone is a reader, there will be a showing of the movie in September before the discussion. Look for the date in the next newsletter.

Call to Order: Charlie Hilla called the meeting to order at 6:30.

Dwelling in the Word: Charlie Hilla led Dwelling in the Word with John 15:5, 11.

Prayer: Charlie Hilla led the opening prayer.

REPORTS:

Secretary's, Parish Accountant and Pastor's Reports: Received as submitted.

NEW BUSINESS:

Considerations for Election of Council Executive Team:

Charlie Hilla, PresidentLinda Wery, Vice-PresidentMarilyn Meister, SecretaryLinda Grunewald, Treasurer

Council Representative Appointments to Standing Committees: Doris Brack, Council Representative to the Gift Advisory Committee Gayle Peot, Council Representative to the Personnel Committee Linda Grunewald, Council Representative to the Nominating Committee.

Building Use Request: Motion to approve the request by the Red Cross for the October drive and that they may continue drives until the spring of 2023. Seconded. Motion carried.

God's Work. Our Hands Sunday: Motion to establish Sunday, August 28th as Bethel's God's Work, Our Hands Sunday to support our two neighborhood elementary schools. Seconded. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

AED & CPR CLASSES: Information was shared regarding what type and where to purchase the AED approved at the May meeting. Council approved a fully automatic AED from American AED for \$1,336.

Buildings & Grounds:

Update on Identified Projects: A brief update on the projects identified and completed. Charlie acknowledged that there are several members who have stepped up to get many of these projects completed and thanks all of them.

Security: A quote was shared from LaForce for a security system for the back outside door. The cost of this system is \$2,552. After discussion Council felt that this is a safety issue for our staff and the need to move forward. Motion to purchase and have LaForce install the system as presented. Seconded. Motion carried.

Roof: A quote from Great Lakes Roofing to put a piece of metal between the gutter and the side of the building which would cover where the birds are getting. The cost of the repair would be between \$5,000-\$6,000. Another company will be contacted for an estimate.

Front Entrance Gutter, etc: Green Bay Gutter Company was contacted for an estimate to install a gutter and downspout on the front entrance of the building. The estimate for gutter and downspouts is \$695 plus an additional \$300 to add a gutter guard. Todd priced out the cost of materials if the work were to be completed by members of the church, and it was very comparable. Motion was made to go forward with the estimate from the Green Bay Gutter Company to install the gutter, downspout and guard with the funds from Capital Improvement. Seconded. Motion carried.

Landscape: A survey class at NWTC completed a survey of the church property as part of a class project. They had two recommendations: 1) It is suggested that we have the catch basin reconstructed. 2) have a landscaper dig a trench to have the water in the back area to run to the parking lot and look at the block wall. Todd will contact a few landscapers to get suggestions on all. **ADA Compliant Doors:** It was brought to the Council's attention that the handicapped door only opens the outside door and not the inside door. Can this be looked into?

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn at 8:06 p.m. Seconded.
