



Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, who is eager to forgive and who loves us beyond our days. **Amen.**


We have gathered in this place to worship,

⁶The LORD will make your vindication as clear as the light and the justice of your case like the noonday sun.


⁷Be still before the LORD and wait patiently.

Jesus* said to his disciples, 'Occasions for stumbling are bound to come, but woe to anyone by whom they come! 2It would be better for you if a millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea than for you to cause one of these little ones to stumble. 3Be on your guard! If another disciple* sins, you must rebuke the offender, and if there is repentance, you must forgive. 4And if the same person sins against you seven times a day, and turns back to you seven times and says, "I repent", you must forgive.'



We are a people holding treasure meant to be given away:


the good news of Christ; resources of time, talents, and money.


God, we ask you to guide the staff and partners at LWR. May their voices and hands be a beacon of hope. Keep them safe. Keep them filled with your strength and perseverance.
