## From the Desk of Pastor Kim

I was always taught it was good to say Thank you. I'm not very good at writing Thank You cards, chalk it up to being a creature of my generation, but I like to make sure I tell people when they do a kindness or good thing. On the other hand, being grateful for who I am and for what I have is something I continually need to learn.

Did you know there is a difference between thankfulness and gratitude? Being thankful or thanking someone often implies you are acknowledging your thanks for something that someone has given

you or done for you. Gratitude takes it even further. Being grateful is about acknowledging and appreciating what one has and who one is while connecting to a deep emotional state. Being thankful exists in the mind or in the moment, while gratitude comes from the heart/soul and is a state of being.

When you have gratitude, it affects everything in your life: mentally, emotionally and physically. Your thought processes become more positive, your emotions transform into a positive, calm, happy state and your body relaxes which brings peace, comfort and healing. Being truly grateful rarely comes naturally but must be practiced and learned.

#### Special Congregational Meeting Minutes: October 23, 2022

(Awaiting approval at the February Annual Meeting)

39 members were in attendance.

Charlie Hilla called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. and Pastor Kim said a prayer.

HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE BACK DOOR: Charlie Hilla shared that at a cost of \$3,427 plus installation fees and the cost of some electrical work we will be able to make the back door completely handicap accessible. Charlie shared that an anonymous member has agreed to pay these costs. After discussion on the way the door would work, the motion unanimously passed.

UPDATED CONSTITUTION OF BETHEL LUTHERAN CHURCH: Pastor Kim and Bonnie Peterson presented an updated draft of the church Constitution and Bylaws. Pastor Kim and Bonnie explained that the Bylaws and Constitution have been combined and shared the changes that have been made. Starred \* items are required by the ELCA. Pastor Kim explained that the bylaws need 1 congregational vote to approve changes and the constitution needs 2 congregational votes. A motion unanimously passed to approve the updated constitution. After approval by the synod, a second vote will be taken at the Annual Congregational meeting on February 5, 2023.

Call to Order: Linda Wery called the meeting to order at 6:30

**Dwelling in the Word:** Marilyn Meister led Dwelling in the Word with passages from Deuteronomy 31:8, Jeremiah 29:11, and Matthew 7:12 and then led the prayer.

#### **REPORTS:**

Secretary, Parish Accountant, & Pastor's Report: Received as submitted.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Red Cross Training:** Linda Grunewald contacted Jim McGinness, a licensed Red Cross Training Provider at NWTC, about setting up training for CPR and AED for people at Bethel. He would be able to do this at a cost of \$40.00 per person. It was decided to ask him if Monday, November 7, or Thursday, November 10, would work for him. Linda will contact him again. Pastor Kim will then put up a poster for interested people to sign up for the training.

**Aebleskiver:** Aebleskiver will be held once again, on February 25, 2023. Gayle Peot will contact April Martin to see if she would be willing to head this up.

**Pastor Kim's Health Care Package:** Motion carried to continue the Gold Plus Health Care Package for Pastor Kim for the coming year.

Annual Meeting: Our next annual meeting is set for February 5, 2023.

Funeral Guidelines: There must be an usher at funerals to execute our worship protocols.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Administrative Assistant Update: Pastor Kim reported that they have contacted a temp agency, Cadre. There is an interested person and an interview is set up for Wednesday. There are several members who have been volunteering in the meantime and things have been getting done.

**Congregational Meeting:** There will be a Congregational meeting on Sunday, October 23 to approve the revised Bylaws/Constitution of the church, and to approve the costs of the Handicap door. Pastor Kim answered a few clarification questions about the changes that have been made to the Bylaws/Constitution and they are ready for a congregational vote.

Fall Clean-up: Fall clean-up, inside and out, is scheduled for November 12.

Homeless Visitor: It has been noticed that a homeless person has been seen on church property and showed up to the funeral lunch. Everyone is welcome to worship, but we do not want to encourage his staying on the property when no activities are happening. Organizations that could help him better than us were discussed. Linda Wery will contact the area alderman and Pastor Kim will contact area service centers.

Adjourn: Motion carried to adjourn at 8:30 p.m. Closed with the Lord's Prayer Next meeting Monday, November 14 at 6:30 p.m.
