
Thanksgiving Worship Tuesday, November 21st, 6:30pm

Advent will be starting on Sunday, November 26th this year. This year, we are paying close attention to how the Gospel of Luke begins the story of Jesus: by interweaving Christ's birth with the parallel story of Elizabeth, Zechariah, and John the Baptist. As we look closely at these birth narratives told side by side, we will see the full scope of

human emotions: isolation, fear, disbelief, as well as connection, trust, and joy.







Call to Order: Charlie Hilla called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Dwelling in the Word: Charlie led Dwelling in the Word with a reading about relationships

from a book, Holy Hygge, by Jamie Erickson, and then led the prayer.

REPORTS:

Secretary & Pastor's Report: Received as submitted.

Parish Accountant Report: Received as submitted. Due to the current budget concerns, we will suspend payment on our ELCA benevolence until the end of the year contingent on what comes in.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Fall Clean-up: Inside and outside clean-up is scheduled for 2 dates, Thursday 10/26 and Saturday 10/28. Many hands will lighten the load!
- **Aebleskiver:** Scheduled for Saturday, February 24. Linda W will contact April Martin to see if she is willing to coordinate this again.
- Annual Meeting: The annual meeting of the church will be February 18, 2024
- **Banners:** Incarnation Lutheran Church donated their banners when their church closed. A place is needed to store these. Charlie will talk to Building and Grounds about a storage area.

OLD BUSINESS:

Budget 2024: The proposed budget for 2024 was reviewed. We will reduce our ELCA benevolence giving to 0, which can then be reevaluated in 6 months, and to designate the Aebleskiver funds as follows: \$1000 to each LSS, Crossways, EPH and FMSC with the remainder for Bethel. It was agreed to give staff a 5% increase for the coming year. The congregational budget meeting is scheduled for December 10.

- **Thrivent Support Presentation:** Pegi is talking to a Thrivent Representative. It was decided that a short talk at announcement time about Choice dollars and Action Team Grants with a time for questions after the service would be good. A date was set for November but due to a conflict this will not work. She will get back to him about a date in January.
- **Photo Directory**: Pastor Kim is working on this. She has received some pictures by email and has taken some. All pictures should be submitted by the end of January.

Adjourn: Motion carried to adjourn at 8:45 p.m. Closed with the Lord's Prayer Next meeting Monday, November 13th at 6:30 p.m.
