

From the Desk of Pastor Kim

The first advent was about the arrival of God into a world of woe, and every advent since invites us to grapple with what Jesus's coming means to our fraught landscapes now. The advent narratives orient us toward a lifetime of faithfulness to the God of liberation, love and peace. How do we rejoice in this time of weariness?

The Patriarchs and Heads of the Churches in Jerusalem sent a <u>LETTER</u> to their churches acknowledging the atmosphere of sadness and pain. They called upon them to stand strong, to forego any unnecessarily festive activities, and focus on the spiritual meaning of Christmas as all pray for a just and lasting peace for *God is with us*.

Even in our daily trials and tribulations, *God is with us*. On Wed, Dec 20th at Resurrection, we will have a Weary Worship or Longest Night Worship where we name our fears, tears, and joy for this season. We will lift up prayers, knowing that God is listening. O Come, O Come Emmanuel!

How Does A Weary World Rejoice?

I think delayed Christmas cards countthe ones with the haphazard stamps, mailed three weeks late. I think the way you get down on all fours to be close to your dog and your cousin's baby counts; it's a holy routine. I think the way you stretch your body awake and breathe deeply when you rise counts; that's Yahweh in your lungs. I think the extra second you spent looking at the sky last night and not being afraid to dance counts. So does giving up your seat on the subway for someone's grandfather, helping her carry the stoller up the stairs, and running to catch the man who dropped his bag in the crosswalk. Lighting candles when the sun disappears, laughing so hard others begin to stare, and pausing to look at trees every once in a while to sav "Good job with that one, God" all definitely counts; as do mumbled prayers and children's prayers and every measure of music. How does a weary world rejoice? I would guess soul by soul and day by day. But if you ask me,

I bet most all of it counts.


